

Code of Conduct

1

Everyone has the right to be treated with courtesy and consideration. As representatives of the school your behaviour to members of the public must reflect the courtesy and consideration expected in school.

Advice

- Be mindful of the need to move sensibly on our narrow corridors and stairs
- Keep right, walk in single file without running
- Hold the door open for the next person approaching
- Be mindful of members of the public when walking to and from school
- Walk not more than two abreast and allow them right of way on the pavement.

It is the responsibility of every member of the community to respect the school environment.

Advice

- Look after your possessions and put them away properly
- Keep the school environment litter and graffiti free
- Remember chewing gum is not allowed in school
- Treat furniture and equipment with respect.

Everyone has the right to work in an atmosphere conducive to learning. Everyone has a duty to maintain this. The classroom should provide an orderly environment in which attention is focused on the task in hand and everyone is treated with respect.

Advice

- Make sure you come properly equipped to lessons
- Settle to work promptly
- Listen to the teacher and accept guidance
- Listen to and respect the opinions of others.

Punctuality on the part of all ensures the efficient running of the School.

Advice

- Arrive promptly and punctually for lessons and registration.
- Complete all work, including homework, to the best of your ability and on time.

The school uniform identifies you as a member of the School community and you are responsible for the reputation of the whole community. Take pride in your appearance outside and inside the school.

Advice

- Aim to look neat and tidy at all times when wearing uniform.
- Make sure you wear the correct uniform as required.
- Remember that jewellery, make-up and hair colouring are not allowed.

Advice

- Anyone found using abusive language, bullying or stealing, or bringing alcohol or cigarettes onto school premises can expect at least a severe reprimand and could face permanent or temporary exclusion from School.
